The most important aim of the organisational committee *IG Capri Switzerland, Community and Tourist Office Churwalden* is to greet you as lovers of the legendary Ford Capri on a wonderful weekend in the holiday region of Churwalden / Lenzerheide in the canton of Graubünden with its unique ambience and adventure in the Bündner mountains.

The Walser village Churwalden (1229 metres a.s.l.) lies halfway between Chur and Lenzerheide. A special highlight is the year-round open, longest sledge run (Rodelbahn) in the world: with 31 curves, a height of 480 metres and a length of 3.1 km – the run (directly at the festival area) offers loads of fun for big and small.

Churwalden is also home to the highest rope course (Seilpark) in Switzerland and a heated outdoor pool. In addition, traditional meat-drying establishments promise delicious specialities.
